LET THE CHILDREN COME TO ME

A STORY OF PREPARING YOUNG HEARTS TO ENCOUNTER THE HOLY SPIRIT

Happy little voices filled the corridors

at Our Lady of Good Counsel Retreat House. The 2nd graders from Cathedral of the Risen Christ School visited for a school-day retreat to get away from their daily routine, go to a special place, and prepare their hearts to receive First Holy Communion. Every child has fond memories of a place they used to visit when they were young, whether that be a family lake house, annual school field trip or summer camp experience. The Retreat House provides a space for those same lifelong memories to be created, rooted in Christ.

Jackie Thompson, the 2nd grade teacher from Cathedral said, “Oh yes, we can make rosaries or banners at school but we wanted more for them. **We were looking for a lifelong experience that they would remember forever.**” The Retreat House staff has been focusing on providing these opportunities for students throughout the diocese, and throughout the state. Teaching students to retreat at a young age is an important part of their spiritual formation. “It was inspiring for the kids to find out they were going somewhere special where priests, their parents, and teachers have gone to learn about their faith. It gave them a better sense of the importance of the sacraments, specifically the Sacrament of First Holy Communion, in which they were preparing.”

The Retreat House gives students a space to run around in the open field playing games, an experience of a rosary walk outside, and offers a spiritual environment for learning. Receiving the love of Christ in the intimacy of the chapel, the heart of the Retreat House, is also a moving experience for the children. Jackie shared that what Cathedral 2nd grade students remember most from their 2nd grade is usually “the sacraments received, and the day they attended a retreat at the Good Counsel Retreat House.”

Fostering a spiritual encounter and retreat experience to our youth nourishes the good soil within them. This is needed for great fruit to grow in their relationship with Christ. It is a space to water the seeds that have been planted through their Catholic education. “**The Good Counsel Retreat House provides an experience of love that is indescribable,**” said Jackie Thompson.

Matt Simmons is one of the regular spiritual directors for our Ignatian Retreats and recently moved his office to the Retreat House to offer full-time spiritual direction.

“The silent retreats are a space of time where we immerse ourselves in the kingdom of God. We do this through the Mass, adoration, and praying with scriptures, all in a silence and space that is pregnant with the Holy Spirit. The experiences vary. Some people have tranquil peaceful retreats, some get stretched by God to grow, heal, and repent of sin. What I always see though, is a person experiencing the living God as real,” Matt explains.

He enjoys directing people on retreat and standing alongside someone as they encounter God as a real, living person and leave with a renewed experience of Him.

Here are some recent graces Matt has seen in people he has led on an Ignatian Directed Retreat:

- Restoration of self and deep healing
- Renewed sense of how to serve as an ordained man
- A man in his 40s experienced God as His Father for the first time in his life

THE LORD IS WAITING

Retreats at Our Lady of Good Counsel Retreat House are silent, meaning that you are asked to turn off your phones, disconnect from the internet, and refrain from unnecessary talking outside of designated times. Our typical weekend retreats include opportunities for Mass, confession, adoration, and spiritual direction; and are preached, meaning the retreat master gives talks to the entire group of retreatants, then allows time for private reflection before the next activity.

There are extended times of Eucharistic Adoration and silence, and also communal prayers like the Liturgy of the House, devotions like the Rosary and Chaplet, and the Mass in which all participate, as well as recordings at meal times.

For those desiring fewer scheduled activities, allowing for additional flexibility and silence, our Ignatian Retreats have no common devotions outside of Mass and Adoration, no recording at meals, and no talks or conferences; rather each retreatant meets privately with a spiritual director once per day. Based on the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the heart of the Ignatian Retreat involves making your own schedule and spending four or five prayer periods each day in meditation on scripture. Thus the true director of an Ignatian Retreat is the Holy Spirit.

For the most flexible and silent retreat, people regularly schedule to come on a private retreat outside of the scheduled retreat times (based on availability, please contact us). A personal, private retreat has no formal schedule, theme, or topic, except as you decide, led by the Holy Spirit. Take time to read, meditate on Sacred Scripture, and pray devotions of your own choosing. Private retreats include a single room with private bathroom and meals available, in addition to 24-hour access to the chapel. We are also now hosting Desert Days for those wanting to make a one-day private retreat.

Most retreats are open to both men and women, married or single, of all ages. Some couples like to attend a retreat together, although they will normally have separate rooms (a few double rooms are available upon request). Some couples also prefer to retreat separately. Note that a few of our retreats are designated for men only, women only, or couples only.

So how do I choose among the many different weekend retreats? Look over the list of topics and see if one interests you (read more about each topic on our website). Some will come because they want to hear a certain priest or retreat director. Others will simply come on the dates that work best for their schedule. No matter which retreat you choose, the Lord will have something to speak to you through the conferences and meditations. Say a prayer and listen to how your heart is moved. He plants the seeds and invites you to “come away and rest awhile.”

RENOVATIONS

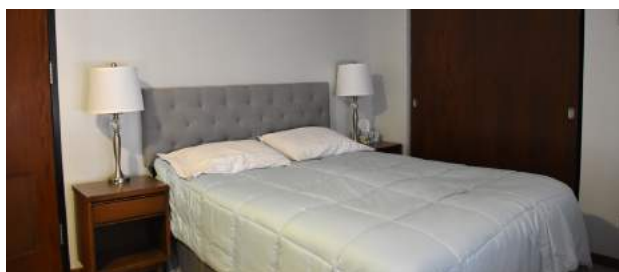
If you have visited Our Lady of Good Counsel Retreat House in the past two years, you have most likely observed some notable changes.

“This means we have to continue working hard to update the facilities, ensuring that we are honoring this sacred space.”

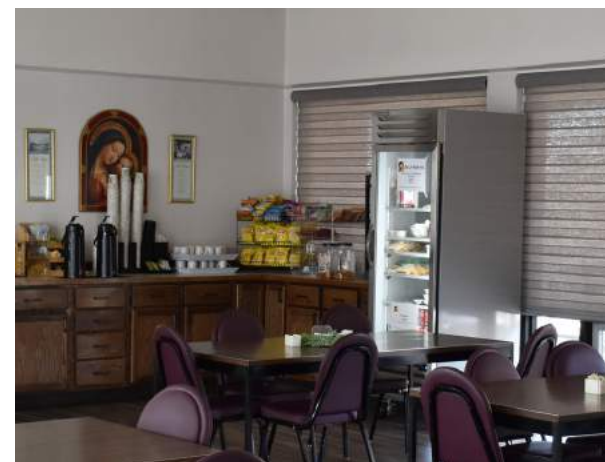
Many of the renovations that have taken place over the past couple of years are due, in part, to the support of generous donors and local foundations. Fr. Coulter continues, “We are grateful to the vision and generosity of our benefactors, and to entities such as the Dillon Foundation, who continue to support us. Without them, our recent renovations would not have been possible.”



In addition to a facelift to the dining hall, which has included new flooring and window treatments, there is now a 24-hour availability of snacks and drinks due to a new snack bar, accompanied by a microwave, toaster, Keurig, and a fully stocked glass front refrigerator. There has also been a new buffet line added to help provide a greater efficiency in serving meals.



The bedrooms have enjoyed some renovations as well, which have included new drapes, carpet and additional lighting for bedtime reading and reflection. The apartment bathrooms have been updated with new lighting, shower heads, fresh paint and new shower tile.



The library has also been updated with new drapes. Additionally, we are happy to share that we have been able to provide new seating for outside reflection, including new benches and rocking chairs positioned around the outside of the Retreat House.

“While there is still much to be done, we strive to continue our work to provide a place that is warm and welcoming for all of those who visit us on retreat or otherwise,” Fr. Coulter says, “And if you have not visited us in a while, we invite you to do so.”

We often hear from people that they don't have time for a retreat, or they are nervous to go on retreat since they have never been on one. Our staff strives to arrange special accommodations, meet your needs as best we can, and tries to calm any fears you may have about coming. We are here to make your experience go smoothly. In fact, it is priority for all of the Retreat House staff, but especially for two of our longest staff members, Tra My Tran and Louann Cao. Tra My, kitchen manager, started at the retreat house in 2006 while Louann, housekeeping manager, started in 2008. Their daily tasks and responsibilities may have changed through the years, but their love for the Retreat House and their dedication to our retreatants has not.

Louann takes great care in preparing a retreatant's room, and the facility as a whole. She is meticulous, and works tirelessly to guarantee a comfortable stay. **Many times, while she is cleaning, she is either praying or singing songs that glorify the Lord.** Everything she does is to serve Him, and ensuring that each retreatant has a comfortable stay is of the highest priority to her. Once she is finished preparing each room and has it just the way she likes it for the arrival of the newest retreatant, no one is allowed to enter the room unless absolutely necessary, to make certain of its utmost cleanliness. We understand this, because we understand that she has prepared the space from her heart.

Tra My has enjoyed her time in the kitchen through the years, but more recently she has enjoyed perfecting her dishes. Surveys are collected after each retreat, and she takes the time to listen, learning what dishes are popular, including several new recipes. Tra My has perfected the comfort foods such as roast beef with homemade mashed potatoes and gravy, provides desserts with almost every meal, and even accommodates food allergies. We hear so often on the surveys that the food is delicious and that **people are so appreciative of an authentic home-cooked meal.** Many of her dishes have become so requested that we now provide catering services for numerous groups within the diocese.

While there are many places to go on retreat, it is difficult to find a staff that puts more love, detail, and care into preparing a room or a meal for a retreatant. We want you to come here and meet the Lord, right where you are, with a comfortable stay that is free from distraction, and filled with all the comforts of home.

The facility has had nice updates, the chapel is lovely, the dining room is really nice; excellent food as well as the staff that served it, top notch! Every person should make a retreat, as everyone deserves the opportunity. It is wonderful 'Soul Food.'

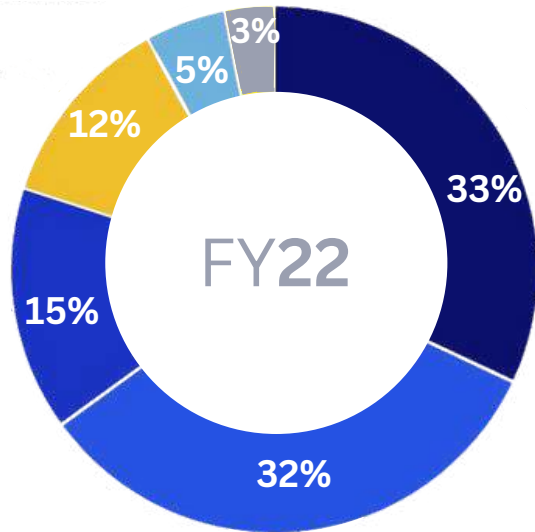

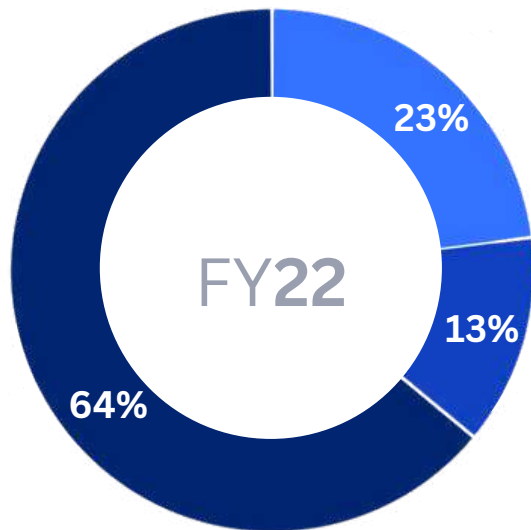

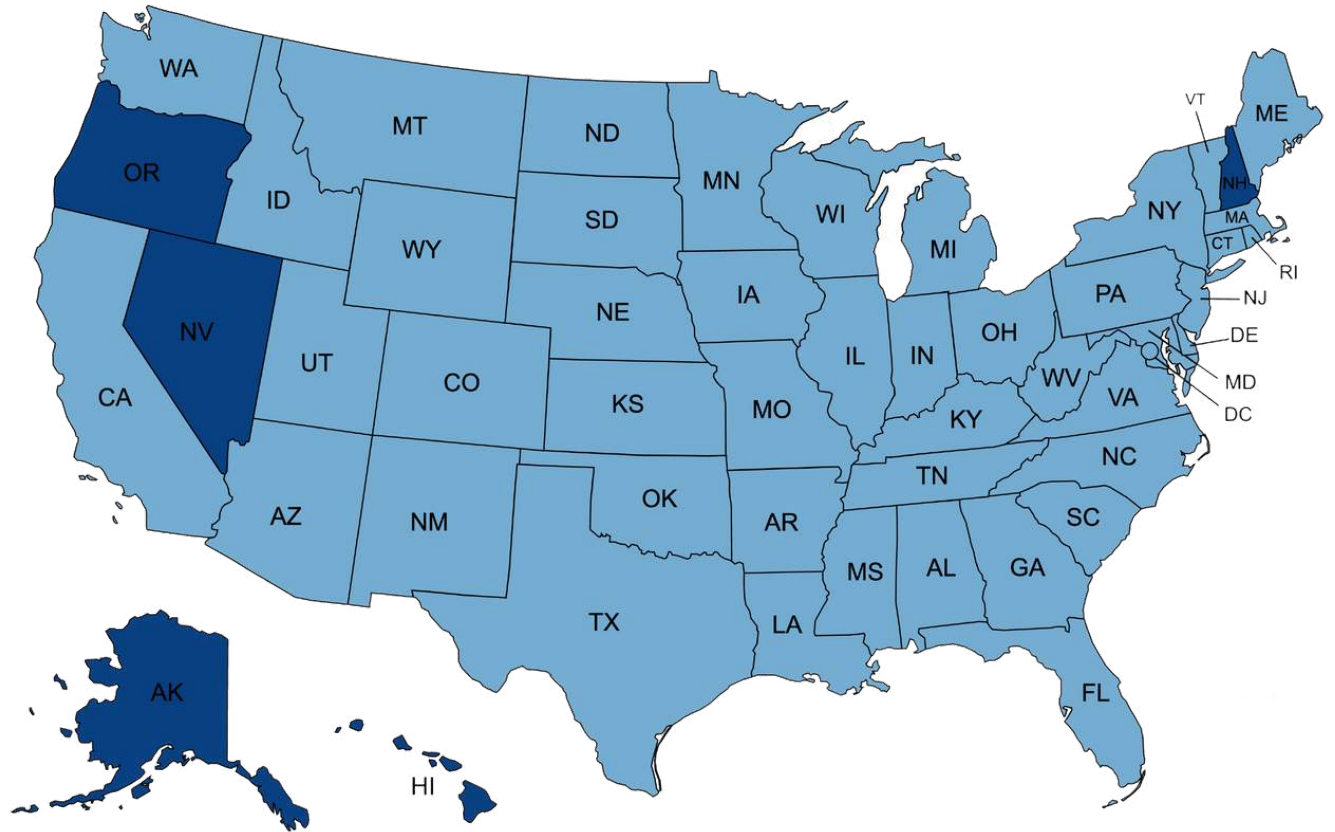
