### **PRIVATE & SILENT DIRECTED IGNATIAN RETREATS**

Our typical weekend retreats, like those given at other retreat houses, are preached retreats where the retreat master gives talks to the entire group of retreatants. In contrast, our **Ignatian Retreats**, listed to the right, also known as **Directed Retreats**, allow each retreatant to meet privately with the retreat director every day.

Based on *The Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola*, the heart of the Ignatian Retreat involves spending four or five prayer periods each day in meditation on scripture. Ignatian Retreatants journal about their prayer times and the movements that occurred, so when meeting with the director, they can be given guidance and appropriate meditations.

Weekend retreats typically begin Friday at 8:00pm with a rosary and Mass, and end on Sunday with Mass and noon lunch. The retreat includes reflections on the topics and scriptures, times of silence and meditation, worship through the Sacraments and Liturgy, devotions and Eucharistic Adoration. Retreats are open to either men or women, except those noted. Retreats are also available via online streaming, except Feb. 10, Feb. 24 and Apr. 6.





### A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR: FR. GARY COULTER



A blessing of being at Our Lady of Good Counsel Retreat House is how it is only a few steps from my room to the chapel. There I find that place to rest in the Lord every day, especially on those days I feel stretched thin. That time of prayer is a lifeline, as Jesus says so succinctly: "I am the vine; you are the branches... apart from me you can do nothing." (John 15:5)

There in prayer I encounter Jesus, the same as people like Bartimaeus and Zacchaeus did. In both cases, Jesus stops, sees them in their need, recognizes the desires of their heart, and in the case of Zacchaeus, Our Lord even knows his name. The Lord has been reminding me in prayer of simple truths I need to learn and must not forget: the Lord sees me, He knows me and my needs, He cares about me, He wants what is best for me—even during my trials.

Yet meditating on both stories, I noticed the encounter with Jesus only takes place after they reach out. Bartimaeus calls as Jesus passes by: "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" And when people told him to be quiet, he cries out more loudly and persistently. Zacchaeus famously climbed a sycamore tree to get a better view of Jesus. He is not ashamed of what others think, nor is Jesus ashamed to associate with a sinner and tax collector.

Because they took the initiative and came face-to-face with Jesus, the course of their life was changed.

I invite you to consider going on a retreat, especially if it has been a while. Take time to rest in the Lord. Encounter Him in prayer. Ask, seek, and knock. Allow the Holy Spirit to touch your heart and change your life. God bless.
